FORMATIVE evaluation studies like this one often:

- · are conducted quickly, which may mean
 - small sample sizes
 - expedited analyses
 - brief reports
- · look at an earlier version of the exhibit/program, which may mean
 - a focus on problems and solutions, rather than successes
 - a change in form or title of the final exhibit/program

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Goals: To determine how visitors use the Skillets Exhibit **Methods**:

Create two conditions:

- After visitor leaves, reset pans to the cold table (correct reset)
- After visitor leaves, reset pans to the hot plate (sabotaged reset)

Findings:

- Very few visitors in either condition touched the hot plate.
- Visitors in the Correct Reset condition spent a little more time at the exhibit.
- Visitors in the Correct Reset condition placed a few more pans on the hot plate.
- Visitors in the Correct Reset condition compared a two pans a few more times.
- Visitors mainly left the exhibit as they found it.
